- CONNECT Educational Leaders in a community that seeks to improve the culture and practice of HIGHER EDUCATION in Canada through
 - Advocacy;
 - Communities of Practice;

 - Reflection;

The Student Fellowship

- •10/year;
- •\$5000;
- Invitation to STLHE conference (accommodation, registration & transportation);
- Delivery of the conference plenary presentation;
- Cohort retreat;
- Cohort project;
- Cohort mentor.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE for NOMINATION?

Nominees must

- be enrolled as a full time undergraduate in a postsecondary Canadian institution;
- have completed at least one full semester of study at the time of nomination;
- have not previously received a 3M student fellowship.



HOW CAN I BE A GOOD NOMINATOR?

- KNOW your nominee:
 - speak IN DETAIL and with CONVICTION;
- SYNTHESIZE the dossier:
 - Create a succinct and meaningful statement for the adjudicators;
- Be PART OF THE PROCESS:
 - Work with the nominee on your nomination letter as the dossier develops.



NOT YOUR PROF'S GRANT APPLICATION

Your dossier is NOT

- A "ticky box" list of achievements and awards;
- A collection of information;
- A box of "evidence";
- An academic paper or proposal.






YOUR DOSSIER IS

- A NARRATIVE about
 - Your values;
 - Your experiences;
 - Your commitments;
 - Your actions;
 - Your lessons and how they have changed you.
- A STORY about who you are as a leader, how you got here and where you want to go.
- A CURATION of materials that demonstrates how you have put your values and leadership into action.



THE DOSSIER'S CONTENTS

- Cover page
- Letters of support (nomination letter, institutional letter of support, reference letters);
- Academic Performance (transcripts);
- Leadership Statement;
- Challenges in Post-Secondary Education (issues your leadership tackles);
- Transformational Educational Experiences (things that have shaped you, fired you up, urged you forward);
- Awards and recognition (those that demonstrate that your leadership is seen and valued by others).





THE THROUGH-LINE: STORY

• BUILD your story around a CENTRAL THEME, idea or experience that will help you to TIE TOGETHER all of your statements and supporting evidence.





CURATING THE EVIDENCE

The dossier is BRIEF (only 15 pages in total), so you must choose your illustrations and evidence carefully. Focus on the following:

- Powerful, vibrant, immediate experiences or anecdotes;
- Evidence that speaks to the SPECIFICS of your story;
- Examples that connect to your THROUGH-LINE;
- Examples and evidence that demonstrate a clear CONNECTION between your VALUES and your ACTIONS.






LETTERS OF SUPPORT

DO NOT

- DO NOT use vague and meaningless language like "exceptional," and "passionate" and "incredible";
- DO NOT choose letters that repeat what you've already said;
- DO NOT include letters from people who do not know you or your work.

DO

- Describe the nominee in language that Is SPECIFIC and ILLUSTRATIVE;
- Choose letters that ADD to your narrative:
 - New details;
 - Context;
 - Reflection on outcomes;
- Choose letters from people who can speak from experience about you as a person and a leader (A letter from a big-wig who speaks in general is not as valuable as one from a peer who knows you).
